The Integrated Marine Observing System, or IMOS, is a nation-wide collaborative program designed to observe the oceans around Australia, including the coastal oceans and the 'bluewater' open oceans. IMOS provides data to support research on many of the critical marine issues facing Australia, including climate change and sustainability of ecosystems.

About the Data User Workshop

The IMOS strategic research-goal is to assemble and provide free, open and timely access to streams of data. The data user workshop aims to increase the awareness and use of the high quality IMOS data, facilitate communication within the marine science community and enable participants to examine practical examples of the data.
